Wallace Heads Slate Approved by Caucus

DEEP RIVER — In a matter of minutes last evening, the Republicans held their caucus and approved the en-

tire town-committee endorsed slate for the November election.

Incumbent Lorraine Wallace, seeking her third term — her second consecutive term — will head the ticket with incumbent Thomas Lindner holding the second spot.

Others endorsed were, town clerk, Evelyn Grohs; town treasurer, Stephen Shaw; agent of town deposit funds and of school deposit funds, Stephen Shaw; tax collector, Roberta Ziobron; Board of Tax Review, Kenneth Rich, six year term, Gwen Fletcher, to fill a four year vacancy; Board of Assessors, John Barry; Board of Education, Dennis Shultz, and Howard

Larson, six year terms, Nellie Johnson, to fill a four year vacancy and Bonnie Ellifson, to fill a two year vacancy.

Also, Board of Finance, Edwin Negrelli, Rita Samuels, six year terms, Stephen Rindos, fill a two year vacancy; Regional Board of Education, Richard Andrews, six years; library directors, Ruth Miller, Caroline Sadlowski and Lillian Judd.

Mrs. Wallace said a new garage is being constructed at the refuse site on Route 80 and a transfer station will replace the dumping operation. Over \$200,000 in federal and state grant money has been obtained by the town and North Main Street is "beginning to look the way we want it to."

"I think," she concluded, "although we will have to work hard, we can stand on our record."

EAST HADDAM — A state law which calls for stricter penalties for dog owners who allow their dogs to run free may help reduce the number of dog bite accidents, First Selectman Ballek reports.

Effective October 1, a dog owner may be fined or imprisoned if their dogs trespass on state roads. Penalties also apply to those who carelessly restrain their dogs from running up trees.
